



NCM+E: Do you charge for website access?

Here are Three of the Venue Vixens' Favorite **Recent Finds:**

The 600-acre River Highlands Ranch in Smartsville near Grass Valley. Catrina Arcularius blogs, "River Highlands Ranch itself offers... the absolute best bridal suite I've seen to date (it's called Duck Pond!). Picture a private pond with a small log cottage set next to it amongst the native oak trees and a sense of quiet and privacy rarely found."

Solage Calistoga, an eco-conscious property with a full-service spa, restaurant and ample lodging. The cottages come with two cruiser bikes apiece, Italian linens and plenty of high-tech amenities. Says Schmalzel, "It's one of those very posh, minimalist properties."
